A shadow interpreted performance has appropriately costumed American Sign Language interpreters embedded in the performance so that the play is presented in two languages simultaneously. Wild Swan Theater, based at Washtenaw Community College, is a children's theater group which is fully accessible to all audiences. Many of its plays are written specifically for Wild Swan and deal with Michigan history. *Marketplace Stories* was developed with support from the Arab American National Museum in Dearborn.
